What is Health Literacy?

 Health Literacy is how patients understand, use, and obtain health information

What is Cultural Competency?

- Cultural Competency is effectively communicating across cultures
- Strong emphasis on broad definition of cultures – including race, age, gender, socioeconomic background, language, ethnicity, etc.

What is Clear Health Communication?

- It is an environment in which health information is communicated in a health literate and culturally competent fashion
- Focused on medical professionals as well as patients
- Systematic changes necessary

Research

- Medical Professional Aware of Patient Communication Issue
 - < 5 yrs exp. = 4.8% Agree
 - 20+ yrs exp. = 66.7% Agree or Strongly Agree
- 60% staff claim difficulty in cross cultural communication
- Medical Professional Believe Patient Does Not Properly Follow Instructions Often or Always
 - < 5 yrs exp. = 4.8% stated "often"</p>
 - 20+ yrs exp. = 64.3% stated "often" or "always"

Research

- Medical Professionals Felt Better
 Communication Could Improve Patient Health
 - < 5 yrs experience = 61.9% Agree</p>
 - > 5 yrs experience = 100% Agree

 57.1% of staff with less than 5 years experience claimed no cultural competency training in last year, despite having had training

Where We Are Going
