HERE is no assignment that could give me greater pleasure than to pay tribute to Harvey Wingo. I take great pride in the fact that I negotiated his joining the faculty at SMU. He served the Law School and the University with admirable loyalty and dedication and completed one of the longest continuing tenures on the faculty.

Harvey taught principally in the fields of constitutional law and criminal law and procedure, and was regularly praised year after year for his excellence in teaching. Students consistently nominated him as one of the very best whom they encountered in their course of study.
