CHARLES O. GALVIN-A TRIBUTE

September 1978 marked the resignation of Charles O. Galvin as Dean of the Southern Methodist University School of Law, a position he had held since 1963. He will return to the faculty as Professor of Law in the fall of 1979. Dean Galvin is perhaps the individual most responsible for the emergence of the School of Law as a major center for legal education. Moreover, in addition to his administrative responsibilities he has pioneered efforts for substantive tax reform.
