Program on International Legal Cooperation

The Faculty of the "Vrije Universiteit Brussel" wishes to contribute to a better mutual understanding between legal scholars and to the greater knowledge of common problems in order to foster cooperation and integration.

The Faculty has therefore decided to create a special post-graduate program entitled "Program on International Legal Cooperation," consisting of two semesters of four months each, covering a full academic year (October, 1972–June 1973).

This program will emphasize the necessity for continued contact between the world's legal systems, including the civil law and the common law. It will encourage the professors and students from abroad and their Belgian colleagues by common study and research effort.

The presence in Brussels of the European Community and other international organizations has the advantage of exposing the student not only to the theory but also to the reality, of those organizations. Moreover, the city of Brussels possesses all the requisite research tools and institutions for such a program of post-graduate work (*e.g.*, specialized libraries, law-institutes, high courts); and the activities of a multitude of other scientific or professional organizations located in Brussels (*e.g.*, World Trade Center, Chambers of Commerce, Common Market Club, etc.) offer an interesting and indispensable addition to basic academic work.
