The Southwestern Law Journal is proud to announce that its former Faculty Editor, Professor A. J. Thomas, Jr., has written a book, Economic Regulation of Scheduled Air Transport (Buffalo, N. Y.: Dennis & Co., 1951), which has just come off the press. The book surveys federal legislation up to the year 1938 by way of background, considers the constitutional basis for regulation of civil aviation, examines into economic regulation of domestic air transport under the Civil Aeronautics Act of 1938, and ends up with a study of economic regulation of international air transport. The book is an authoritative work carefully done, and the *Journal* extends its congratulations to Professor Thomas.
